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Nomenclature is a library providing access to linux's namespace manipulation functions. The current version exposes the raw syscalls.

Syscalls to manipulate linux namespaces.

`nomenclature.syscalls.setns` (*fd*, *nstype*)

Reassociate thread with a namespace

Parameters

- **int** (*nstype*) – The file descriptor referring to one of the namespace entries in a `:directory::/proc/<pid>/ns/` directory.
- **int** – The type of namespace the calling thread should be reasscoiated with.

`nomenclature.syscalls.unshare` (*flags*)

Disassociate parts of the process execution context.

Parameters **int** (*flags*) – A bitmask that specifies which parts of the execution context should be unshared.

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
